Marilyn Boysen: Camouflage Mask

Nature, the main ingredient in Cedarhurst's new exhibit of masks

Southern Illinois' artist Marilyn Boysen has been making masks since childhood. The masks evolved from the early "make-believe" creations to unique Halloween masks and later graduating to her current elaborate works of art. Her "Woodland" and "Camouflage" mask series are featured in the Beal Grand Corridor exhibit Marilyn Boysen: Masking Nature, which opened Saturday, October 31 at Cedarhurst Center for the Arts in Mt. Vernon.

A love of nature, the woods, the seasons, the subtle colors, and opulent textures wooed southern Illinois' artist Marilyn to compose a palette of these materials which she used to create her masks. Over the years as Boysen visited museums, her favorite exhibits always included the examples of ethnological art. Intrigued as to why these art objects were created, she was drawn to how they were constructed and what materials were used; fascinated with the rich textures created by natural fibers such as tree bark, human hair, grasses, reeds and shells.

The exhibit, which is open to the public free of charge during regular museum hours, is cosponsored by Wells Fargo Advisors .
